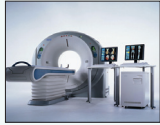

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# 2010 Year In Review

## ADVANCED TECHNOLOGY

■ CHH upgraded its hospital-based CT Scanner and is now offering a more advanced and powerful computed tomography (CT) system – the Aquilion™ 64. With the new scanner, exams are completed within seconds, with improved diagnostic accuracy and increased patient comfort and safety. In addition to fast CT scans, CHH expects to significantly increase its exam capacity – which means more patients can receive the treatment they need faster and be referred to surgery or released from the hospital.



■ The Center for Cancer Care has added a new service for cancer patients affected with lymphedema, a condition of chronic swelling and tissue inflammation as a result of some surgery and cancer treatments. Certified lymphedema therapist Michelle Mojon Whitford, MS, OTR/L, MHA, CLT provides relief by attempting to move fluids out of the affected area by using multi-layer compression bandaging, remedial exercise and skin care.



## CRITICAL PARTNERSHIPS

■ Chief Flight Nurse and Associate Program Director Lisa Graziano stopped by Charlotte Hungerford Hospital to offer thanks and recognition to the hospital for its continued partnership with the LIFE STAR Transport Service. LIFE STAR is an integral part of the expanded services offered by CHH, transporting medically compromised and high-risk pediatric and neonatal patients and patients experiencing trauma, cardiac, stroke and respiratory emergencies from our Emergency Department.



■ CHH and Hartford Hospital demonstrated their critical collaboration in cardiology services by presenting a free heart health program on what patients need to know about prevention, diagnosis and treatment for heart disease and strokes. The evening brought together CHH Cardiologist Michael Fowler, M.D., of Torrington's Associates in Cardiovascular Medicine, and Eric M. Crespo, M.D., M.P.H., an electrophysiologist from Hartford Hospital's Cardiology Department.



## IMPORTANT MILESTONES

■ CHH has been developing and implementing a Patient Care Support Network that utilizes the most advanced information technology available to improve patient safety and medical care. In 2010, it exceeded \$1 million in donations and pledges as part of a multi-year giving campaign to support the ongoing initiative. ■ CHH paid special thanks to its staff at their annual Employee Service Recognition Dinner held at Crystal Peak Banquet Hall. Each year, full-time, part-time and per diem hospital employees are selected and honored based on their years of service in five-year increments and are given special gifts. This year, the hospital recognized a total of 119 employees, including five with 25 years of service and 11 celebrating 30 years.



## VALUABLE EXPERTISE

■ Radiologist Peter Lee, M.D., of Torrington Radiologists Group and The Charlotte Hungerford Hospital, have expanded the pain management services offered at the hospital and the Hungerford Diagnostic Center, 220 Kennedy Drive, Torrington. Dr. Lee specializes in pain management spinal injections that deliver a combination of local anesthetic and steroids to the source of pain in the spinal column or pelvis to provide patients long-term pain relief.



■ CHH has an important advocate and resource for area Hispanic women as part of its Early Detection Breast Cancer Program. Patricia Pepen is the hospital's Outreach Educator and works to connect with the area's Latina population and offers education on the importance of early detection of breast and cervical cancer.



## HEALTHY PROGRAMS

■ Community outreach activities included sponsoring free mammogram days, a social service day for area homeless and underserved, Earth Day activities, skin cancer screenings, quarterly bereavement services of remembrance and an awards breakfast for local child advocates by the CHH Child Abuse Investigation Team.



■ CHH was one of 19 hospitals across the country that participated in a project with the Joint Commission Center For Transforming Healthcare. CHH is assisting in developing an interactive targeting solutions tool to help improve hand hygiene and help provide guidance in addressing and removing barriers to proper standards and practices.



# CHARLOTTE HUNGERFORD HOSPITAL RECEIVES NATIONAL JOINT COMMISSION REACCREDITATION

The Charlotte Hungerford Hospital has earned The Joint Commission's three-year accreditation Gold Seal of Approval™ by demonstrating compliance with national standards for healthcare quality and safety in hospitals. The standards are developed in consultation with health care experts, providers, measurement experts and patients. Founded in 1951, The Joint Commission seeks to continuously improve healthcare for the public, in collaboration with other stakeholders, by evaluating healthcare organizations and inspiring them to excel in providing safe and effective care of the highest quality and value.

CHH underwent a rigorous unannounced on-site survey in September 2010. A team of Joint Commission expert surveyors evaluated CHH for compliance with almost 600 standards of care and the

following national patient safety goals:

- Accurate, timely reconciliation of all our patient's medications
- Prevention of patient falls
- Prevention of hospital associated wounds or pressure ulcers
- Identification and care of "high risk" patients and care
- Accurate identification of all patients at all times
- Making sure that communication among hospital staff, medical staff, and our patients and families is timely, technically accurate, and respectful
- Making sure that our infection rate is as close to "zero" as humanly possible. CHH is thankful and proud of its 1 percent hospital infection rate compared to the national rates ranging from 5 percent to 10 percent.

## Hospital Auxiliary
