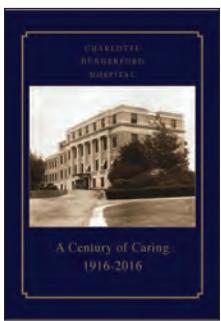

Honoring Our Past – A Year Of Celebration

100TH ANNIVERSARY BOOK "A CENTURY OF CARE: 1916 – 2016"



CHH published a special anniversary commemorative book that chronicles the people, places and events of the last century. 100TH ANNIVERSARY GALA

CHH held a wonderful evening of celebration on September 24 attended by over 200 guests at the Torrington Country Club featuring cocktails, dinner, a silent auction and dancing to The Cartells. The event raised over \$50,000, which was used to benefit patient care initiatives and establish a permanent memorial to the hospital's founders.

CHH CORNERSTONE BOX DISCOVERY

With the help of some old photographs, documents and a few local businesses, CHH located a copper box that was placed in its tower building's cornerstone at a dedication ceremony in December 1929. The box was



opened at the commemoration ceremony and contained early photographs, annual reports, coins, and several wonderfully preserved newspapers.

100TH ANNIVERSARY COMMEMORATION CEREMONY

Over 150 hospital staff and supporters assembled at sunset in the hospital's front circle on October 5 for a special commemoration ceremony and opening of the hospital's cornerstone box revealing contents from 87 years ago. Special guests and presenters from the hospital, places of worship and city and state offices presented scripture, historical readings, proclamations, personal recollections and a tree dedication.

"CENTURY OF CARE" HISTORY EXHIBIT



In early October, CHH presented a weeklong free pop-up history exhibit and talks featuring portraits, photographs, artifacts and documents collected by CHH since its founding. Vintage medical supplies and equipment offered a unique glimpse into early medical technology.

COLLECTION RESTORATION

CHH restored two of its historic paintings of its namesake Charlotte Austin Hungerford and her son hospital founder and benefactor Uri T.

100TH ANNIVERSARY HISTORY MEMORIAL



On December 16, the hospital installed and dedicated a permanent memorial and area of reflection featuring brass reliefs and biographies of Charlotte and Uri Hungerford on a granite obelisk. Two benches inscribed with the words “Honoring our Past” and “Building our Future” and memorial bricks also adorn the area.

Moving Forward – Our Present & Future

ACHIEVEMENTS & CERTIFICATIONS

CHH once again earned a Joint Commission’s Gold Seal of Approval® for Hospital Accreditation by demonstrating continuous compliance with its performance standards. CHH scored among the top community hospitals in the nation, achieving satisfactory compliance in performance of 3,078 measures out of a total 3,100 measures with improvement plans for complete compliance well under way. CHH Service providers including the CHH Sleep Center, CHH Mammography, CHH Child Abuse Investigation Team, Winsted based Laboratory Services, Radiation Oncology Service, and PET/CT Scanner all received accreditation from their respective certification organizations in 2016. CHH was listed on *Becker’s Hospital Review* list of 100 Great Community Hospitals and was one of six Connecticut hospitals to receive a Leapfrog Group Best Practices and Hospital Safety Grade of “B.”



SERVICE QUALITY & PATIENT SAFETY

The quality and safety of our healthcare services and facilities remains our top priority. At CHH, zero infections is our ultimate goal, and we know it comes down to how effective we are each day at preventing infections. Our hospital takes great pride in the care and services we provide, and is always looking for new ways to improve the quality of care for our patients.

Our staff and physicians continuously conduct inventories of all infection control activities and search for improvements to our infrastructure, process, procedures and protocols, education, and equipment. CHH also works with and participates in programs and high reliability initiatives with Connecticut hospitals and the Connecticut Hospital Association to help reduce the incidence of hospital-acquired conditions and providing the best quality care to patients.

In 2016, CHH reviewed and implemented best practices for Infection Control, Surveillance and Prevention including new protocols for infection control and house wide re-education and competency assessments. It also added a new Infection Control /Prevention Officer with specialized training in epidemiology, initiated a Hartford Healthcare Infection Control Council Membership to share best practices among other Hospitals, and continued the hospital-wide incorporation and training of CHA’s High Reliability Initiative

Our dedicated caregivers work very hard to see that our patients get the best possible care. We know, however, that there is always room for improvement. We are pleased to report some immediate progress with our most recent infection control efforts have showed promising results and significant improvements in our scores. In 2016, CHH reduced C-Difficile rate by close to 60 percent, class 1 Surgical Site infections by 28 percent, and catheter associated urinary tract infections by 17 percent.

CHH also continued a comprehensive, six-phase, multi-year, renovation and expansion project that will provide modernization and infrastructure enhancements for the Emergency Department.



ECONOMIC GROWTH & IMPACT

Connecticut Hospital Association’s annual report on the economic impact that hospitals have on their local economies and job markets provides eye-opening statistics on our impact as the region’s largest employer. In total, CHH had a direct economic impact on our community of more than \$251,287,000 including providing 770 full-time jobs, with a total payroll of \$70,852,000. Dollars earned by CHH employees and spent on groceries, clothing, mortgage payments, rent, etc., generate approximately \$71,738,000. Each year CHH spends about \$45,419,000 on the goods and services needed to provide healthcare. Funds spent by Charlotte Hungerford Hospital on buildings and equipment total \$8,592,000. This expenditure generates an additional \$8,700,000 in local economic activity each year.



NEW SERVICES & TECHNOLOGY

The CHH Multi-Specialty Group added Torrington Pulmonologists Richard Krinsky, DO, and O’Neil Green, MBBS, who relocated to the CHH main campus as did the CHH Ear, Nose and Throat practice of Otolaryngologists Frank Luzzi, MD, and Alexis Bouteneff, MD. A new Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery Service headed by Amir Nasir, MD, was also introduced and the Thomaston Primary Care office headed by Roberta Meltzer, MD, expanded its staff and relocated to a larger location at 76 Watertown Road, Thomaston. The Radiology Department introduced a new state-of-the-art PET/CT scanner and CHH also began using a new mobile lithostripsy unit.



COMMUNITY OUTREACH & EDUCATION

CHH continued its commitment and presence in the community completing a second Community Health Needs Assessment which provided a valuable snapshot of health trends and statistics in the region. CHH held its annual service of remembrance and butterfly release, free smoking cessation classes and hosted Red Cross blood drives and organ donation awareness day. CHH Center for Cancer Care and its Pulmonary Services Department introduced new supports groups, and CHH and Brooker Memorial presented a free talk on fall prevention and diabetes nutrition.



PARTNERSHIPS FOR THE FUTURE

On February 24, 2016, the CHH Board of Governors adopted a resolution to enter into a non-binding Memorandum of Understanding with Hartford HealthCare to work toward a formal affiliation. With these steps, CHH and Hartford HealthCare begin a process of due diligence over the coming months when both parties will evaluate and finalize the details of the future partnership. By mid-year, the parties had drafted and approved a definitive agreement and set in motion the extensive regulatory processes required for final approval. At year end, CHH and Hartford HealthCare submitted paperwork for the necessary Certificate of Need approval to the State of Connecticut and were working to continue the process. CHH hopes to hold public hearings and finalize the partnership with Hartford Healthcare sometime in 2017 after which an exciting new era of healthcare will begin.
